ASSESSMENT METHODS	Oral exam and essay. During the oral exam the student must answer at least 4 or 5 questions about the whole programme and the themes of the course. The final exam aims at assessing if the student knows and masters the topics of the questions he or she has been asked and if he/she has reached the expected targets. The exam is passed if the student shows that he/she knows and understands the topics dealt with in the course. The essay aims at the production of 5 terms found in Plurilingual authors in the form of a Dictionary (forms, meanings, diatopic distribution, Their presence in dialectal idioms and proverbs; historical remarks, examples of usage in literary pluringual works).

#### EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES OF THE MODULE

This second module is a prosecution of the first part of the course in the form of a workshop. It is addressed to students of the "Occidentale" (Western languages and cultures) curriculum. At the end of the first module (see the Description of the course of "Linguistica italiana livello avanzato – 9 cfu", addressed to students from both curricula), a picture on the history of many words representing the more native core of Sicilian lexical heritage will be given. Both words deriving from Latin as well as the ones resulting from the several contacts with different languages and cultures in the Medieval period will be taken into account with constant attention to cognates from other Mediterranean and European languages. On the other hand, since most of these dialectal words are now old and archaic, it will be possible and meaningful to detect that such words are nowadays (re)used in Literary pluringual writing.

The second module will therefore give the student a chance to read passages by pluringual Sicilian writers searching for autochthonous Sicilian and Southern dialectal words as a preliminary work within a project aiming at building a great Thesaurus/Dictionary of Southern lexemes used in Plurilingual wiriting.
